# Newtown Public Library Library Director's Report March 19, 2019

#### **Statistics:**

#### Circulation

February circulation (7,146 items) was down by 3% from the month before (7,393 items). Like last month, circulation was the best we'd seen in February since 2012! We expect that in 2019 circulation will be better than both 2017 and 2018.

## Public Computer Usage

February public computer usage (261 sessions) was down over the month before by 18%. This marks the lowest amount of sessions since at least 2008.

#### Wi-Fi Sessions

February Wi-Fi sessions (5,025 sessions) was down by 19% when compared to January (6,238 sessions). It was still the third highest amount of sessions since the new Wi-Fi system was installed.

#### **Library Visits**

Our library visits in February (5,578 visits) were best since we started using the current people counter device. No visits were recorded last month so it is not possible to compare the months.

## **Youth Services Update**

From Angela Hegadorn, Youth Services Librarian:

"March has been a busy month so far. Our story time attendance has been very high, averaging about 30 kids for baby and toddler times. We had a very fun, fancy tea party that was so popular, we are doing a second one. Our Youth Services Library Assistant Ava Cardonick did a fantastic job preparing decorations and crafts for this program.

This month I attended the premier of Longwood Garden's Community Read StoryWalk at Rose Tree Park. Several libraries helped with different STEM activities for attendants. Local media covered the event. We will host an in-house program around the Community Read initiative in April.
